Arrangements have been made to hold the convention at the Holiday Inn, 3803 13th Ave. S., Fargo, known for outstanding accommodations and quality service. The Sons of Norway Kringen Lodge, 722 2nd Ave. N., in downtown Fargo will be the site for the opening Memorial Service on Thursday at 5:30 p.m., followed by the District IV President's Reception and Dinner at 7:00 p.m. Registration, which includes meal tickets, will be Thursday 3:00 – 4:45 p.m. at the Holiday Inn and resume Friday morning. A bus will leave the Holiday Inn at 4:45 p.m. for the Kringen Lodge.

NORWEGIAN EGG COFFEE

Scandinavian immigrants popularized this distinctive brewing method in certain parts of the United States, and it remains a regional favorite to this day. The egg does not flavor the coffee, but instead clarifies it by filtering out bitterness and impurities. The result is an unusually smooth and mild brew.

3 cups boiling water

3 T coffee

1 egg

3 T cold water

Mix the coffee, egg and cold water and add to boiling water and simmer for 3 minutes. Turn off heat and add 1 cup cold water. Strain and serve
